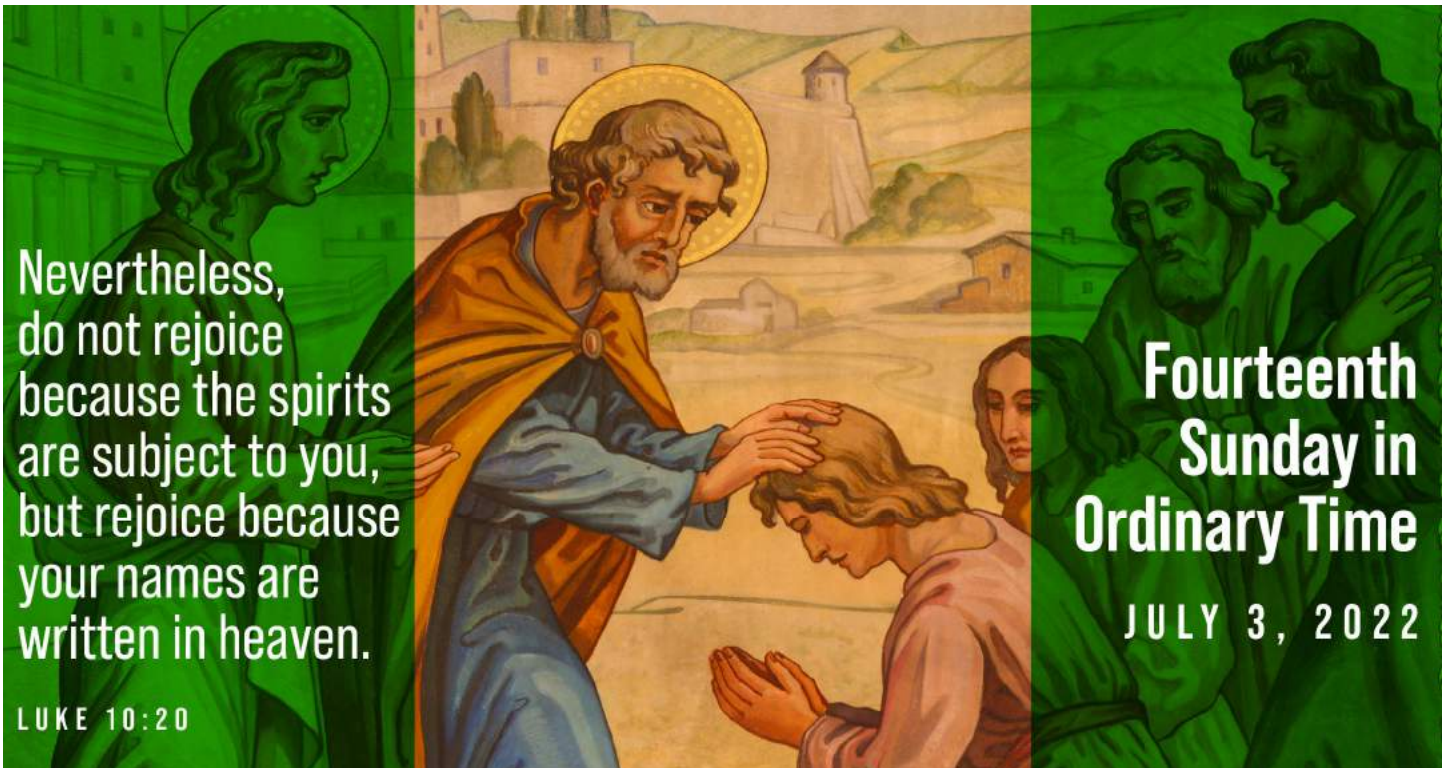

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"Our Blood-Signed Declaration of Independence"

Dear Friends,

The Fourth of July is the day in which we celebrate our independence or freedom. An important question that we can ask on this day is, "what is the nature of this freedom?" Are we celebrating freedom *from* something? Or are we celebrating freedom *for* something? Or is it both? Is it freedom for the sake of freedom? Or freedom to live according to the truth?

Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati once said, "To live without faith, to have no heritage to uphold, to fail to struggle constantly to defend the truth: this is not living. It is scraping by. We should never just scrape by, but really live." Frassati continues, "Modern society is drowning in the sorrows of human passions and it is distancing itself from every ideal of love and peace. Catholics, we and you, must bring the breath of goodness that can only spring from faith in Christ."

Frassati's words remind us that there is an important relationship between what our nation celebrates and what our faith celebrates. The founding fathers declared, "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness." Our faith proclaims that these (life, liberty, happiness) is definitively achieved in Christ.

Our Faith rejoices over the Good News that God has come to restore life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness. Thus, all men should be allowed the freedom to pursue these:

Life: "A thief comes only to steal and slaughter and destroy; I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly." (Jn 10,10)

Liberty: "Hence, now there is no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. For the law of the spirit of life in Christ Jesus has freed you from the law of sin and death." (Rom 8,1-2)

Happiness: "If you keep my commandments, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and remain in his love. I have told you this so that my joy may

Jesus then said to those Jews who believed in him, "If you remain in my word, you will truly be my disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." (Jn 8,31-32)

History relates that there were many battles and much blood

shed in order to obtain our freedom. Today we give thanks to God for all of those who fought for this, so that we may exercise such rights freely. It also reminds us that such a battle still wages today and it is a fragile thing that we must protect.

In our faith, we recount the one definitive battle for independence waged in the Garden, at the pillar, along the streets of Jerusalem and atop the mount of Calvary. It was a battle won – not by military might or bullets – but by Christ's love, His outstretched arms upon the cross. In short, the declaration of humanity's independence was signed by the blood of Christ in an act of obedience to the Father.

We recall this Independence Day every day at the holy mass, but unlike the 4th of July we are not just remembering, we are participating. We are not just looking back at Calvary, but Calvary is made present. In Holy Mass, the sacrifice of Calvary is made present to us in a sacramental manner through the ongoing priestly ministry of Jesus Christ (see CCC 1362-1368).

In a sense, the Mass is not a declaration of independence, but a declaration of dependence: the Christian declaration that we can never be truly free or truly good without God.

Two Hundred and forty-six years ago, tomorrow, a document was written to declare our independence formally. Let us not rescind the value of this document by becoming slaves to freedom itself, but servants to God and man (whose dignity is endowed by their Creator and independent thereof). We are created in the image and likeness of God, we are made by Him and long to return to him. Perhaps, now more than ever, we must declare our independence from sin and disobedience so that we may fulfill our duties as citizens of the United States as Disciples of Christ.

MASS INTENTION REQUESTS

The calendar is currently open for Mass intention requests for the months of July & August. We will open the book for August on July 1st.

Please follow the requirements listed below.

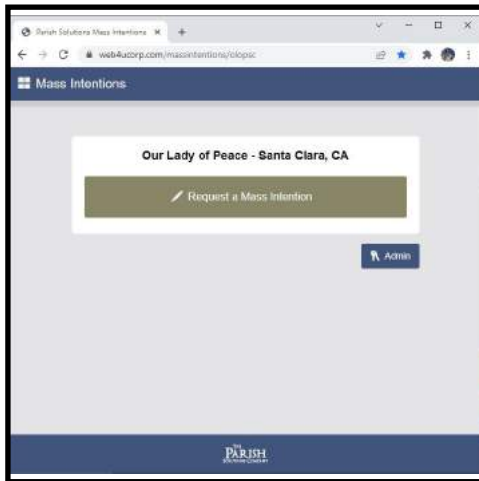
Mass Intention request requirements:

- Donation of \$10 per Mass
- Limit of 1 individual Mass per week. Do not request more than 1 non-collective Mass in the same week.
- Each Mass may only have 2 names with a limit of 30 characters (including spaces) per Mass request.
- Please remember to note if the request is for someone living or deceased.
- Only one intention option chosen (see below table for available options).
- No changes can be made once the requests have been placed into the calendar.
- No holds or reservations will be accepted. No exceptions can be made.

How To Request Mass using the Online Portal

In order to request a Mass Intention, please carefully follow the steps written on the page and also in further detail on our website page: bit.ly/olop-mass-requests

1. **Go to our online portal.**



2. **Choose a Mass time to request.** If you don't see a time listed, it is not available and a pending/approved request was already made.
3. **Enter in all the details for the Mass request.** Each individual Mass intention may only have up to 2 names with a limit of 30 characters (including spaces) per Mass request.
4. **Choose only one intention option** to add onto the

name(s) (see table below)

5. **Submit your Mass request.** This removes the time slot from the calendar, which prevents duplicate requests.
6. **Clicking "Donate Now" will take you to our online Donation portal.** You can also donate in person at the office or by mail. If you are donating by mail, please include your name, intention information, and phone number.
7. Once the request is received, our staff will double check for availability. Until the intention request is finalized by a confirmation reply email, the intention is not considered entered in the calendar. You will receive a call if there are any time conflicts or changes needed.

Intention Options and Examples

You may choose one of the intention options available to add onto the names for the Mass request. Please refer to the examples below to see acceptable and unacceptable wording.

- Joe & Mary & Isaac & Esther & James Sample (too long, too many names)
- Prayers for good grades for Isaac & James (too long, no name, does not follow correct format)
- The Sample Family Business, Inc. (must be for persons, not entities)
- +Anne Sample, Birthday (invalid option for deceased person)
- Esther Sample, Health & Thanksgiving (more than one option chosen)

PARISH REGISTRATION

Are You a Registered Parishioner?

If you are over the age of 18 and attend Mass here regularly, we encourage you to register as a member of Our Lady of Peace parish.

Three main reasons why registering is important:

1. Make Sacrament prep easier when the time comes.

Infant baptisms, religious education registration, being a godparent/sponsor for baptisms or confirmations, and especially getting married (whether you are getting married at this parish, another parish, or having an international Catholic wedding) all involve record of parish participation. If you're not a registered parishioner, this will greatly delay the process.

2. Letters of Recommendation

Sometimes there are occasions where letters of recommendations are needed from your parish pastor (ie Catholic school enrollment, scholarships, godparent eligibility, etc.). If you're not registered, we cannot provide

this letter to you or your family.

3. If we as a parish do not know who is out there, how can we serve the needs of all?

This includes single people or young families who may not see the need to register.

Anyone, regardless of where they live (even though the Diocese is divided into parish geographical areas), is welcome to register at OLOP.

Please note: there is a three (3) month waiting period from the date of registration before being considered a full-fledged registered parishioner. Any requests for pastor signatures on any forms, letters, or wedding preparation paperwork will not be processed within the 3 months.

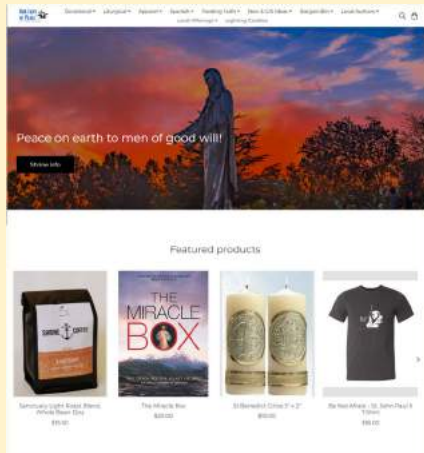

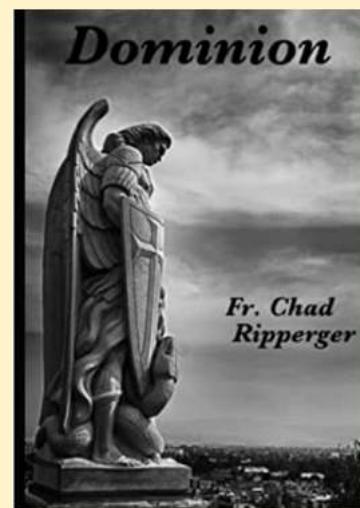
